Open Access Philosophy.

Five Experiments with Philosophical Editions on the Web

We present a joint research enterprise, which aims to publish scholarly editions of philosophical texts on the Web and to link them to the relevant critical literature published in philosophical journals. To test new models of online publication, five experiments will be conducted:

1) The *semantic linking* experiment will connect the digital objects with ontological classes that express the most important domain concepts.

2) In the *Contexta* experiment, primary and secondary sources will be linked transforming references contained in journal articles into bidirectional links.

3) The Open Peer Review experiment will combine traditional double-blind peer reviews with different modes of open peer review and post-review comments.

4) The goal of the *Linked Open Data* experiment is to offer a unique access point to the federation content and to offer the reader advanced search and browsing features.

5) Within the Private-Public Partnership Open Access *business models* experiment, the German publisher *ONTOS Verlag* will experiment with different open access business models for hybrid publication of philosophical journals and monographs.
